Land Preservation

The Scott Conservancy has acquired and placed under protection over 77 acres of green space in nearly three decades of conservation work. Kane Woods Nature Area is 72.5 acres. The remaining 5 acres are located along Vanadium Road. The land is open and free to the public to enjoy.

Recreation and Education

The Scott Conservancy's two miles of hiking trails in Kane Woods Nature Area are open for year-round public use. Individuals and groups use the Nature Area for their environmental and educational programs, as well as for service projects. We are pleased to make Kane Woods available as a place where Eagle Scouts, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and local students come to complete their projects and develop their understanding of nature.

Come walk the trails to see these service projects in use to benefit everyone.

Community Beautification

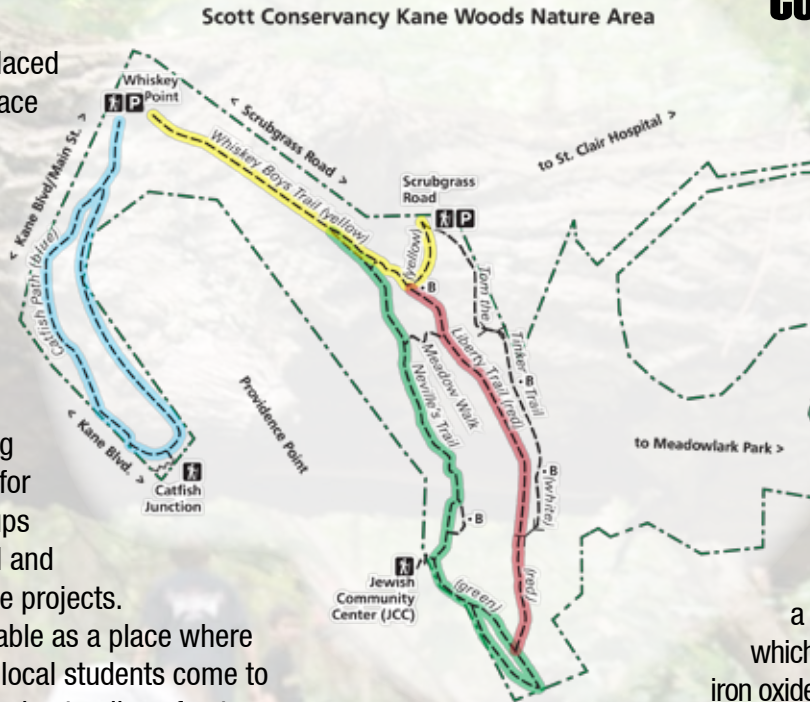
In partnership with Scott Township, Scott Conservancy maintains the traffic islands at the intersection of Greentree Road and Cochran Road. The turf is cut regularly and the trees, shrubs, and flower beds are tended by dedicated volunteers.

As motorists travel through this intersection—or wait for their turn at the traffic signal—they can enjoy a beautiful and welcoming introduction to our community.

Stream Mitigation Project

The Scrubgrass Run Abandoned Mine Drainage (AMD) Project, located near the Kane Woods property, uses a collection pond to passively mitigate the AMD pollution which would otherwise flow into Chartiers Creek. The orange iron oxide sediment recovered from the site, referred to as yellow-boy, is recycled and used for pigment in paints and dyes.
